2018 Was A Lesson In Overcoming Obstacles

As many of you know, on August 15, 2018, a faulty toilet exchange valve in the South County Outreach office caused water to flood our food pantry, computer lab, and staff offices. The flood caused more than \$140,000 in damage, and disrupted our program delivery for more than three months.

The flood was an important reminder that crisis affects everyone. It may not occur overnight—like a flood—but instead, may progress slowly as a result of job loss, illness, divorce, or even the unexpected shutdown of the federal government. The crises that often lead to eviction and homelessness occur in many forms, and the rebuilding that ensues is often costly, stressful, and slow-moving.

Thankfully, in the aftermath of our crisis, various donors and volunteers showered South County Outreach with all kinds of support that allowed us to continue offering services, and quickly repair and re-open our food pantry. In so doing, they showcased the importance of having a network of support that enables those in crisis to overcome their obstacles.

South County Outreach is that network of support for those presently facing homelessness. And, when our clients find a home, the effects of homelessness often endure long after. A few of the common obstacles our clients must overcome are:

- · Depleted savings accounts.
- · Wages that do not keep up with the cost of living.
- High day-care costs.
- Lingering effects of eviction judgments and poor credit.

South County Outreach exists to provide solutions to those families presently in crisis. Your investment in South County Outreach and our community is part of that solution! We are grateful for the support of our volunteers, the cities we represent, the schools and faith groups in our local communities and the many businesses, corporation and individual donors who contribute annually. We assisted more than 5,000 people in 2018, and with your continued support, look forward to helping even more in 2019.





2018 CONTRIBUTION PROFILE.






Distribution of Income: \$2.93M

HOUSING PROGRAMS

South County Outreach purchased its first condominium to house a homeless family in 1994. Today, 17 condominiums remain dedicated to homeless families. Our approach to ending homelessness includes three tiers of housing: Transitional, Affordable, and Rapid Rehousing.

HOMELESS PREVENTION PROGRAM

Providing rent and utility assistance is one of our most significant achievements in preventing homelessness. The **cost to prevent** an eviction and homelessness for a family is approximately **five times less** than the **cost to re-house** them once they have lost their home.

Our volunteers are crucial: Volunteers register new clients, stock shelves and assist families in the Food Pantry, along with pick up and drop off barrels for food drives. They also participate in our seasonal programming for clients, teach Computer Learning Lab classes, work in the Thrift Store, and answer the calls of those in need.

COMPUTER LEARNING LAB

In 365 days, we've...

Taught 80 classes and workshops to 179 students on subjects including the Microsoft Office suite, LinkedIn skills, and resume building.

UPSCALE RESALE THRIFT STORE

As South County Outreach's sole source of revenue, Upscale Resale sells gently used clothing and household goods to the community. Upscale Resale provides clothing and household vouchers to our clients to help them apply for jobs, make a house feel like a home, or feel more confident and prepared in school.
